

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 218-54 OF THE CITY OF COATESVILLE'S PARKING CODE TO PROVIDE FOR PERMIT PARKING AT CITY HALL PLACE PARKING LOT AND AT HARMONY STREET LOT No. 1, ADDING RESERVED EMPLOYEE AND TWO HOUR CITY HALL BUSINESS PARKING AT CITY HALL PLACE PARKING LOT, REMOVING 2 HOUR LIMIT FOR PARKING WHERE PERMITTED PARKING IS INVOLVED AND RE-SETTING PERMIT FEES AT \$25.00 PER MONTH FROM \$12.00 PER MONTH

WHEREAS, the City of Coatesville is a Third Class City located in Chester County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the City of Coatesville has two public parking lots in the City immediately adjacent to City Hall referred to as the "City Hall Place Parking Lot" and the "Harmony Street Parking Lot No. 1" which require additional regulation to provide assurances that there are available parking spaces for City employees and City visitors and to control other uses of such lots; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the current regulations and has determined that it should restrict certain locations at the City Hall Place Parking Lot to two hour business only parking, provide for employee parking and authorize permit parking in excess of two hours for a monthly fee of \$25.00; and

WHEREAS, THE City has similarly determined that with respect to the Harmony Steet Parking Lot No. 1, that permit parking in excess of two hours should be permitted for a monthly fee of \$25.00;

WHEREAS, in order to effectuate such regulation, amendments to the City Code are required;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the City of Coatesville does hereby amend Section 218-54 of the City Code governing metered, permit, and unrestricted off-street parking lots as follows:

1) Section 218-54 A. City Hall Place Parking Lot subsections (4) and (5) are amended and new subsections (6) and (7) are added as follows:

- a) The current subsection (4) is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "(4) Parking limit: two hours - except for vehicles with a valid parking permit issued by the City and publicly displayed."
- b) The permit fee in subsection (5) is amended from "\$12.00 per month" to "\$25.00

per month”

- c) A new Subsection (6) and (7) are added providing:

“(6) Visitor Parking: Five spaces are reserved for visitors with business at City Hall and such parking space use is limited to two (2) hours of parking.

(7) Employee Parking: All parking spaces at the far west of the parking lot are reserved for “Employee Only Parking”.”

2) Section 218-54 C. Harmony Street Parking Lot No. 1 subsections (4) and (5) are amended as follows:

- a) The current subsection (4) is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: “(4) Parking limit: two hours - except for vehicles with a valid parking permit issued by the City and publicly displayed.”
- b) The permit fee in subsection (5) is amended from “\$12.00 per month” to “\$25.00 per month”

All other terms of the City Code governing parking, including, without limitation, the procedures addressing violations and enforcement, shall remain in full force and effect.

If any portion of the Ordinance shall be determined to be unconstitutional, illegal or unenforceable, then the portion and only that portion of this Ordinance, which is deemed to be unconstitutional, illegal or unenforceable, shall be severed from the remainder of this Ordinance and all other terms thereof shall remain in full force and effect.

This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after publication following final adoption in accordance with the City Charter and the Third-Class City Code.
