**RESOLUTION APPROVING SUBMISSION OF GRANT APPLICATION TO
DELAWARE VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION 2011-TCDI**


WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Coatesville has determined that it is appropriate to submit a grant application to the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission for a 2012-TCDI Grant in the amount of \$120,000.00 to support the continued development of a inter-municipal network of alternative transportation choices, bicycle and pedestrian trail networks and an industrial heritage focused interpretive streetscape experience that further develops and supports local collaborative revitalization efforts between the City of Coatesville, the Borough of South Coatesville and the Borough of Modena in order to create an amenity along the Brandywine River; and

WHEREAS, the City of Coatesville is partnering with the Borough of South Coatesville and the Borough of Modena in order to submit a grant application to the DVRPC for said funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Coatesville as follows:

1. That the Council does hereby approve and authorize the submission of a grant application to the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission for a 2012-TCDI Grant in the amount of \$120,000.00 for the purpose above noted.
2. That the pledge of matching funds required for the 2012 – TCDI Grant shall be shared by the Borough of South Coatesville, Borough of Modena and the City of Coatesville.
3. That the appropriate City Officials are hereby authorized to execute and submit said grant application on behalf of the City of Coatesville, Borough of South Coatesville and the Borough of Modena.


