

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-30

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COATESVILLE, CHESTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA TO BORROW \$95,076.06 (REDUCED FROM PREVIOUSLY APPROVED RESOLUTION 2013-12 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$96,736.06) FOR A COSTAR CONTRACT FOR PUBLIC WORKS VEHICLES

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Coatesville, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

WHEREAS, The City of Coatesville, a Third Class City and Home Rule Municipality located in Chester County, Pennsylvania (hereinafter the "City") wishes to purchase certain vehicles; and,


WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of General Services provides COSTAR CONTRACTS for the purchase of vehicles pursuant to contracts which are exempt from public bidding requirements for participating municipalities like the City; and,

WHEREAS, The City has previously approved Resolution No. 2013-12 to enter into COSTAR CONTRACT NO. 025-117 to purchase 2 public works vehicles (trucks) for a total net price of \$96,736.06, which amount reflected the then-determined cost for up-fit, delivery charge (and netting out of trade in vehicles) and provided City Council approval pursuant Section 47-4 of the City Code; and

WHEREAS, the actual cost of the borrowing has now been reduced to \$95,076.06 based upon the final invoice with credit for trade-ins, an amount which the City wishes to memorialize.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Coatesville by resolution confirms its prior authorization granted to the City Manager, City Finance Director or City Council President to execute the COSTAR CONTRACT NO. 025-117 to purchase 2 public works vehicles (trucks) and establishes that the borrowing is now reduced to \$95,076.06 for such purposes, said resolution superseding the prior resolution permitting borrowing of a greater amount as referenced herein.
