



CITYWIDE HEALTH CURFEW

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – APRIL 15, 2020

Coatesville, PA. Effective April 15, 2020 from 8pm to 6am each day, the City of Coatesville will implement proactive emergency management measures in the form of a curfew to address the spread of COVID-19.

This declaration was created to mitigate the severity of this public health emergency by protecting the health, safety and welfare of residents in the City of Coatesville.

“Our efforts to curb the infection rate of the COVID-19 virus resulted in a request to City Council to issue a supplemental declaration of emergency in accordance with Section 19-1 of the City Code to activate the City’s Emergency Management Team,” stated Michael Trio, City Manager.

The City Manager, Director of Emergency Management, and Emergency Management Team will work with the Chief of the City of Coatesville Police Department to coordinate enforcement of the above referenced prohibitions.

“As challenging as these recommendations may seem, they are needed to stem the rising number of cases throughout the city, county and state,” said Trio. “COVID-19 poses a serious threat to our quality of life, health, safety, and economy, but we will continue to fight this pandemic while supporting and educating our residents with day-to-day news updates and helpful tips.”

This is a critical time for us all, and it is also the best time to show everyone how resilient Coatesville 19320 really is!

The City of Coatesville’s leadership and Council members are prepared to help combat this virus by doing their parts to keep residents informed and protected.

As we continue to monitor the updates from our county and state officials, we are recommending that Coatesville residents continue to practice good social distancing to prevent community spread. Remember the tips:

1. Maintain social distancing of at least six feet
2. Wash hands thoroughly and frequently with warm water and soap
3. Clean and disinfect your home focusing on frequently touched areas including: door handles, counter tops, light switches, hand rails, bags, and shoes.
4. Wear a mask in public
5. Avoid groups
